Slate of Officers:

TIMOTHY W. DIGGINS | *President*

A Member of the Boston Athenaeum since 1996 and a Proprietor since 2013, Mr. Diggins has served on the Board of Trustees since 2017. Mr. Diggins is a member of the Hannah Adams Society and the Armstrong Society, and is a donor to the expansion into 14 Beacon Street.

Mr. Diggins retired as a partner of Ropes & Gray in 2023, where he was a member of the firm's corporate department, and served as the co-head of the firm's sovereign investment and derivatives practice groups. He is co-chair of the Brigham and Women's Hospital Leadership Council and Director of A Far Cry orchestra and was a long-time Trustee of the Boston Ballet.

Mr. Diggins holds a JD from the University of Chicago and a BA in Latin and Greek Classics from Holy Cross. He studied in Germany under a grant from the Deutscher Akademischer Austauschdienst. Mr. Diggins has pursued his interests in the Classics since college, and has collected a substantial personal library of works in Latin and Greek. It was the Boston Athenaeum's collection of Latin and Greek works, and of ancient philosophy and commentaries, that initially drew him to the Athenaeum.

SUSAN B. WEATHERBIE | *First Vice President*

A Member and Proprietor of the Boston Athenaeum since 2009, Susan B. Weatherbie is an active member of the Boston cultural community and passionate about art, travel, classical music, and reading. Mrs. Weatherbie has served on the Board of Trustees since 2011 and was elected Vice President in 2016. She currently chairs the Special Collections Committee and is active on the Standing Committee. She is a member of the Hannah Adams Society and the Armstrong Society, and is a donor to the expansion into 14 Beacon Street.

Mrs. Weatherbie graduated magna cum laude from Mount Holyoke College with a major in Sociology. She has worked for 23 years in the legal profession, first for the Boston law firm of Herrick and Smith, and then for the firm of Choate, Hall, and Stewart. At Mount Holyoke College, she was a Trustee for 10 years, was a member of the Art Museum Advisory Board for 17 years and chair for 8 years. She also served on the Alumnae Development Committee and the Campaign Steering Committees for the 2003 and 2011 Campaigns.

At the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, Mrs. Weatherbie serves on the Board of Trustees. She is the Chair of the Collections Committee and serves on the Budget and Finance Committee. She is a member of the Board of Advisors of the Handel and Haydn Society. Mrs. Weatherbie is a native of South Hadley, Massachusetts. She and her husband split their time between Boston (their primary residence), New Hampshire, and Florida.

MELISSA FETTER | *Second Vice President*

A Member of the Boston Athenaeum since 2019 and a Proprietor since 2020, Melissa Fetter is a community volunteer and the founder and owner of Beacon Hill Books & Cafe in Boston, MA.

With an interest in equitable access to the arts, education, and public broadcasting, Ms. Fetter is a past Vice-Chair of the NPR Foundation, a current trustee of Boston's NPR affiliate, WBUR, a current trustee of the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum, and is the Chair of the Cantor Center for the Visual Arts at her alma mater, Stanford University. Ms. Fetter is also a founding board member of the Smithsonian's American Women's History Museum Advisory Board.

ARTHUR B. PAGE | *Secretary*

A Member of the Boston Athenaeum since 2014 and a Proprietor since 2015, Arthur B. Page is an avid reader, interested both in history and ongoing issues in society and disparate communities, and is a frequent attendee at Athenaeum programs. He views the library as "a sanctuary of beauty, treasure, and knowledge in a time-challenged world; as a community of diverse and inquisitive thinkers, respectful of old, new and contrary ideas; and as an institution with a responsibility to make learning and scholarly thought available to ever-wider audience through the use of technology."

He has served on the Board of Trustees since 2017 and was elected Secretary in 2018. He is active on the Nominating & Governance Committee, the Special Collections Committee, the Standing Committee, and was on the Search Committee for the next Stanford Calderwood Director. He is a member of the Hannah Adams Society and is a donor to the Campaign for 14 Beacon Street.

Mr. Page joined Hemenway & Barnes in 2008 and brings with him 30 years' experience representing non-profit institutions. He serves as a trustee of various foundations that support, among other interests, scholarship, the study of women artists, and of the photographic profession. He is chair of the board of the Travis Roy Foundation which provides adaptive equipment grants to those paralyzed through spinal cord injuries and research funds focused on recovery of motor function and independence. He occasionally skates with (or against) Mr. Enriquez in charity hockey events.

He is a graduate of Harvard University, Hastings College of the Law, and Boston University Graduate tax program.

F. JAVIER CEVALLOS | *Treasurer*

A Member of the Boston Athenaeum since 2020 and a Proprietor since 2021, Dr. F. Javier Cevallos is the President of the American Academic Leadership Institute and former President of Framingham State University, which was founded in 1839 by noted education reformer Horace Mann as the first public university dedicated to the education of teachers. Dr. Cevallos began his career in education as an assistant professor of Spanish at the University of Maine at Orono. Later, he moved to the University of Massachusetts at Amherst, where he served as a professor and faculty advisor to the provost. In 1997, he became chair of the Department of Spanish and Portuguese and soon after, he was appointed Vice

Chancellor for Student Affairs. Before beginning his tenure at Framingham State University in 2014, he was President of Kutztown University in Pennsylvania for many years.

Dr. Javier Cevallos was born in Cuenca, Ecuador and his family moved to Puerto Rico when he was 14. He earned his bachelor's degree at the University of Puerto Rico at Mayagüez. From Puerto Rico, he moved to Illinois where he earned his master's and doctoral degrees from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. His area of research is Latin American literature, with particular emphasis on the Colonial era. Dr. Cevallos has served on the boards of AASCU, NCAA Division III President's Council, the United Way of Tri-County, Jewish Family Service, and the MetroWest Chamber of Commerce. He also serves as a Commissioner of the regional New England accrediting body for higher education. He is also a former Board member of the Reading Museum in Pennsylvania.

For a term of three years:

EARL M. COLLIER, JR. | *fourth term*

Mr. Collier has spent his career in healthcare, starting as a lawyer in Washington, DC, most recently as CEO of Arsenal Medical, from which he retired in 2015. From 1997 to 2010, Mr. Collier was Executive Vice President at Genzyme Corporation, where he was responsible for building and overseeing several of Genzyme's business units. He also has served as President of Vitas Healthcare, a partner at the Washington, DC-based law firm of Hogan and Hartson, (now Hogan Lovells) and as Deputy Administrator of the Health Care Finance Administration (now CMS) in the Department of Health and Human Services. Mr. Collier sits on the boards of Capricor, Benchmark Senior Living, the Codex Foundation and the Boston Athenaeum. He served as Chair of the Board of Trustees of Newton-Wellesley Hospital and is Chair Emeritus of the Massachusetts General Brigham Innovation Growth Board. He is a member of the Grolier Club in New York and the Book Club of California in San Francisco. He earned a BA at Yale University and a JD at the University of Virginia Law School.

MICHAEL EWALD | *second term*

Michael Ewald is a Partner, Global Head of the Private Credit Group, and Portfolio Manager for the Middle Market Credit and Global Direct Lending strategies at Bain Capital, a leading global alternative asset manager with approximately \$185 billion in assets under management. He also serves as CEO of Bain Capital Specialty Finance, Inc. (NYSE: BCSF), a publicly traded business development company, and Bain Capital Private Credit (BCPC), a non-traded business development company.

Prior to joining Bain Capital in 1998, Michael was an Associate Consultant at Bain & Company where he focused on strategy consulting to the Financial Services, Manufacturing and Consumer Products industries. Earlier in his career, he worked at Credit Suisse First Boston as an analyst in the Regulated Industries group.

Michael currently serves, and has served in the past, on a number of corporate and philanthropic boards. He is a Trustee of the Boston Athenaeum (one of the oldest and most distinguished independent libraries and cultural institutions in the United States), a Trustee of the Massachusetts Historical Society (the country's original repository of millions of rare and unique documents, artifacts, and irreplaceable national treasures), and a member of the national Board of Directors of Cradles to Crayons (a non-profit organization that provides resources, such as school supplies and clothing, to homeless and low-income children). Michael is also a member of the MBA Council at the Tuck School of Business, a group which provides the Dean of the School and his staff support and insights into the MBA program and its various

components, and the Council on Foreign Relations, a non-partisan think tank and publisher seeking to inform U.S. engagement with the world.

Michael received an M.B.A. from the Tuck School of Business at Dartmouth College and a B.A. from Tufts University.

ANNIE MACLACHLAN LEWIS | *first term*

Annie MacLachlan Lewis was a member of the Athenaeum in the mid-2000s until she moved to Washington, D.C. After returning to Beacon Hill, she rejoined the Athenaeum in 2023 and became a Proprietor in 2024. Ms. Lewis currently serves as Global Head of Government and Social Impact at Meta, where she leads support for governments, nonprofits, and civic entities. Since joining Meta (formerly Facebook) in 2013, she has held roles designing and implementing marketing solutions and support for government and social impact organizations, in both the US and globally.

Before Meta, Ms. Lewis worked at Atlantic Media Strategies as Director of Strategy and Client Engagement and began her career at Google managing high-value advertising accounts.

Ms. Lewis holds an MBA from Harvard Business School and an AB in History from Harvard University. She serves as Treasurer and Secretary of the Stella P. Holt Foundation, member of the Friends Council at The Esplanade Association, and member of the Harvard Schools & Scholarships Committee. She is also an active supporter of her alma mater, The Winsor School, serving as both a Class Agent and Corporation member.

GEORGE B. RAINE | *first term*

A Member of the Boston Athenaeum throughout the mid-2000s, George B. Raine rejoined and became a Proprietor in 2024. Mr. Raine is a partner at Ropes in Gray in the asset management group. His practice includes the representation of U.S. and non-U.S. investment advisers; open- and closed-end investment companies and their trustees; real estate investment trusts; and broker-dealers.

Mr. Raine joined Ropes and Gray in 2005, having begun his career in the New York and Frankfurt offices of an international law firm based in New York. He earned his LLM, magna cum laude, from Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin in 2000. Prior to that, he received his JD from Yale Law School in 1999, where he served as an Editor of the Yale Law Journal. His undergraduate studies were completed at Yale University, where he earned a BA in History, summa cum laude, and was inducted into Phi Beta Kappa in 1996.

Mr. Raine served as Clerk of the Vestry at the Church of the Redeemer in Chestnut Hill (2014-2023), where he previously contributed as a diocesan delegate, Sunday school teacher, and committee member. Since 2022, he has been a member of the Commonwealth Shakespeare Company's advisory board. He also maintains strong connections to Yale through multiple avenues: serving on the Yale Club of Boston board (2005-early 2010s), the membership committee and board of governors of the Elizabethan Club, completing a term on the Yale Law School Association's Executive Committee (2015-2018), participating in the New England planning group for Yale Law School alumni, and remaining active on the alumni schools committee since 2005.

AUSTIN SHAPARD | *fourth term*

A Proprietor of the Boston Athenæum since 2015, Mr. Shapard has served on the Board of Trustees since 2016. He currently chairs the Investment Committee and is active on the Budget Committee.

Mr. Shapard has been President & Chief Executive Officer of Fiduciary Trust Company since 2014. Prior to joining Fiduciary, he held several senior leadership positions at Rockefeller & Co., the global wealth management firm, including President & COO and Vice Chairman. Before Rockefeller & Co., Mr. Shapard was an Associate Principal at McKinsey & Co. within its financial institutions group.

Mr. Shapard holds a BA in history from Yale College and an MBA in Finance and Entrepreneurial Management from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania. He serves on the boards of the Peabody Essex Museum, the Anthony Trust Association, and the Provident Loan Society of New York.
