## Dining at the Union Club of Boston

Boston Athenaeum donors enjoy exclusive dining privileges at the Union Club of Boston. The following guidelines outline dining options and protocols:

### Dining Locations and Hours

- Red Room: Breakfast, lunch, and dinner
- Everett Bar: Lunch, dinner (bar menu from 5:30 – 8 pm), and cocktails

### Weekday Dining Hours

- Breakfast: Monday – Friday, 7:30 – 9:30 am
- Lunch: Monday – Friday, 12 – 2 pm
- Dinner: Tuesday – Friday, 5:30 – 8 pm

Please note: Dinner service is suspended during the summer months. It concludes on the last Friday in June and resumes on the Tuesday following Labor Day.

### Reservations

Reservations are required. To make a reservation, please contact the Union Club at (617) 227-0589 or [reception@unionclub.org](mailto:reception@unionclub.org). The maximum reservation is eight guests.

Athenaeum donors may use the Everett Bar or Red Room up to twice per month, and no more than ten times per year.

### Attire

For members and guests in the clubhouse, contemporary business casual is considered minimally acceptable attire.

For men: a collared shirt, dress slacks or dress denim (jeans that are styled to be suitable for more formal occasions, are generally darker, may have a more tailored fit than casual jeans, and are not ripped or distressed), and non-athletic shoes. While business casual is acceptable, a jacket and tie are always appropriate.

For women: suits, dresses, skirts, tailored slacks or dress denim (jeans that are styled to be suitable for more formal occasions, are generally darker, may have a more tailored fit than casual jeans, and are not ripped or distressed) paired with a tailored top, with or without a jacket or elegant sweater, and non-athletic shoes.

For those dining in the Red Room, denim is permitted for breakfast and lunch, but not dinner, and gentlemen are requested to wear a jacket. Ties are welcome but optional.

The following apparel is prohibited in the main areas of the clubhouse: ripped or distressed denim, leisurewear of any type, capri and cargo pants, rompers, shorts, leggings, t-shirts, sportswear, bare midriff tops, mini-skirts, athletic clothing, flip flops, and athletic shoes.

**Cell Phone Policy**

Members and guests must limit cell phone calls to the Business Center, the first-floor phone booths, or private rooms, and refrain from making calls in hallways, dining rooms, the bar, or other shared areas where conversations may be overheard. Keeping devices on silent mode while in the Club's public spaces is encouraged. Personal devices may be used discreetly for text messaging and data.

**Payment**

Athenaeum members must pay by Visa or MasterCard at the time of service. Billing is not available.
